| <b>Remove dead vegetation.</b> Clear dead plants, grass, and leaves.  |

| <b>Prune trees and shrubs.</b> Keep tree branches at least 10 feet apart and trim those that overhang your roof |
| <b>Maintain lawn and plants.</b> Keep grass short and select fire-resistant landscaping.                        |
